Japan's main road sign quick reference



Understanding the meaning of signs so you have a safe and enjoyable drive trip

Road sign guide the directions to drivers, alert them to drive safely and let you know what rules to follow. Driving ignoring the traffic rules leads to traffic accidents. Follow the traffic rules to have secure and safe driving trips.

Regulatory signs



Road closed to all

All of pedestrians / Vehicles / Trams are not allowed to pass.



Road Closed to Vehicles

Vehicles (Vehicles / Small motor vehicles / Light Vehicles) are not allowed to pass.



No parking or stopping

Vehicles are not allowed to stand and park. (The numbers above indicate the time of prohibition, in this case it's from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm)



No parking

Vehicles are not allowed to park. (The numbers above indicate the time of prohibition, in this case it's from 8:00am to 8:00pm)



Stop

The vehicles must pause just before the stop line. When there is no stop line, you must pause before the intersection (sign).



Slow

Vehicles must drive slowly (a speed in which a vehicle stopped immediately).



Maximum speed limit

Vehicles may not drive faster than indicated.



Minimum speed limit

Vehicles may not drive slower than indicated.



No vehicles

Vehicles are now allowed to enter. (It is often seen at one way exits)



No right turn crossing ahead

Vehicles are not allowed to cross the road. (Vehicles can cross the road with a left turn to enter and exit facilities outside the road)



No U-turn

Vehicles are not allowed to perform a U-turn.



No overtaking

Vehicles are not allowed to overtake.













Directions permitted

Vehicles may not go beyond the direction of the arrows.





One way

Vehicles must follow the direction indicated by the arrow. Travelling the opposite direction is not allowed.



Dedicated traffic zone

It is a dedicated traffic zone for vehicle types displayed on the sign. (In this case, it is dedicated zone for buses)

Warning signs Warning signs in Japan are diamond shape



Slippery road

It indicates that the road ahead is slippery due to freezing etc.



Falling rocks

It indicates that there is a risk of falling rocks on the road ahead.



Bumpy road

It indicates that there are bumps on the road surface ahead.



Roadworks

It indicates the road is under roadwork.



Steep ascent

It indicates that there is a steep ascent ahead.



Steep descent

It indicates that there is a steep descent ahead.



School zone

It indicates that there is a school, kindergarten and nursery school ahead.



Traffic light ahead

It indicates that there is a traffic light ahead.



Traffic merges (from the left)

It indicates that there is merging traffic ahead.



Left lane ends

It indicates the number of lanes decreases ahead.



Road narrows on both sides

It indicates that the road width becomes narrower ahead.



Two-way traffic ahead

It indicates that there is two-way traffic.



Railroad crossing ahead

It indicates that there is a railroad crossing ahead.



Beware of cross winds

It indicates there is a risk for crosswinds.



Beware of animals

It indicates that animals may jump out onto the road.

Indication signs



Parking allowed

Vehicles are permitted to park.



Stopping allowed

It indicates that vehicles are permitted to stand.



Preferred road

It indicates the signpost road is the preferred road.



Center line

It indicates that the position of the sign is the center of the road or the center line.



Stopping Line

It indicates that the position of the sign is the position where the car must stop.



Safety zone

It indicates it is a pedestrian safe zone, and vehicles are not allowed to enter.



Crosswalk

It indicates there is crosswalk ahead.



Bicycle crossing lane

It indicates it is bicycle crossing zone.

Informatory signs



It indicates the direction of the motorway entrance.



It indicates number of Japan's National Routes.



It indicates directions and towards.
